

Title: Pipeline Integrity Technician

Department: Integrity Services

Location: Remote

Position Overview

Level II shall have the skills and knowledge to set up and calibrate equipment, to conduct tests, and to interpret, evaluate, and document results in accordance with procedures approved by the Quality Manager. The Pipeline Integrity Technician – Level II shall be thoroughly familiar with the scope and limitations of the system and software and should be capable of directing the work of trainees and Pipeline Integrity Technician - Level I personnel. The Pipeline Technician – Level II shall be able to organize and report test results.

Requirements:

- Should hold at least 1 x Specialized Operator / Equipment Certification and 1 or more years of experience in those disciplines.
- Shall hold at least Level II Magnetic Particle Testing (MT) and Level II Ultrasonic Testing (UT) NDE Discipline Certifications and at least 5 to 10 years of inspection experience.
- Should possess strong problem solving and communication skills along with high capabilities to utilize computers and cloud-based data management and reporting systems.
- Should possess strong skills in basic Microsoft Office platform tools such as Word, Excel, Power Point, Outlook.
- Should possess strong skills or exhibit the ability to adapt and learn enhanced skills in the following Microsoft Office platform tools: Teams, SharePoint, Forms, and other apps in the suite.
- Should be capable of writing Inspection Test Plans (ITP's), and capable of supporting the development of Work Procedures (WP's) within their disciplines and realms of expertise and experience.
- Should be capable of being qualified to and acting in the capacity of a Quality Control Auditor within the IAG Quality Management System to perform field audits on the various activities that impact the Integrity Services Division.
- Shall be capable of acting in a Crew Lead position and fulfilling all the field project responsibilities associated with the projects they have been assigned along with directing any Pipeline Technicians or Pipeline Trainees working within their inspection crew.
- Shall be capable of directing the work of trainees and Pipeline Integrity Technicians - Level I and Level II personnel.
- Shall be capable of performing QA/QC review functions on their own deliverables material that meets or exceeds the defined Quality Reporting process targets for the Integrity Services Division reporting systems to ensure the quality standard is being met and maintained.
- Shall be able to organize and report test results across the different inspection tools, ITP's and services they are qualified to operate within the Integrity Services Division.
